Does our worship do more than entertain us? Does worship provide opportunities for us to think the faith so we are better able to *live* the faith in our lives? How well do we care for our members? When we most need one another for support and presence are we present to one another? Do we hurt with those who hurt and rejoice with those who rejoice? Do we have a vision for our ministry, some sense of where we are going and what it is our mission is all about? Do we share the joy of the good news when we engage to do the work of the church? These aspects of our ministry together are more difficult to quantify and gauging success in these areas is a

Permanent Funds Ministry

Over the long history of our church, it has been generously supported by its members. This support has been provided in many ways – by gifts of time and talent, and also through pledges and other monetary offerings and gifts. The money you give supports the ministry of the church, as you know, by providing and maintaining our beautiful sanctuary and other buildings that enrich our worship and life together, by attracting talented and devoted leaders, and by enabling benevolent outreach to our members, our community, and the world at large.

Your prayerful consideration of increasing your financial support in the coming years will allow us to expand our ministry further, especially as we seek to add an Associate Pastor to our staff.

However, if any of you contemplate making special gifts, above and beyond your regular offerings, please consider donating to one or more of our Permanent Funds.

You may remember that, last fall, Session acted to create three Permanent Funds. The largest of these is the General Endowment Fund. The purpose of the General Endowment Fund is to serve as a contingency reserve for <u>major</u> unforeseen events or circumstances incapable of being funded through our operating budget. In the meantime, absent such events or circumstances, the income of this fund will be prudently distributed to the other two funds. The second of the three Funds, the Benevolences Fund, will periodically distribute its earnings by charitable contributions to worthy causes as determined by the Outreach and Missions committee of the church. The third fund, the Capital Fund, is to invest in major expansion, improvement or renovation of the physical facilities of the church not foreseen or provided for in the operating budget or capital fundraising campaign (if any.) Several generous gifts have already been received.

If you are thinking about making a bequest to the church through your will or otherwise, you may wish to consider designating it to one or more of these Funds. Another opportunity may be to consider a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD.) The QCD allows a person receiving a distribution from a retirement account (IRA) to direct all or part of it to a charity. The amount of the QCD is not taxable; effectively reducing taxable income without the necessity of itemizing deductions. (Be sure to consult your own financial and/or tax advisor.) If you wish, you may also consult with a representative of the Texas Presbyterian Foundation for other beneficial ways of supporting the church and/or its Permanent Funds. Your thoughtfulness and generosity is always most appreciated and will help secure our mission



	Adults – Jimmie Johnson leading, main room


