Frederick Buechner reminds us that in many cultures there is a long-standing custom of giving a tenth of each year's income to some holy use. For us, it's the idea of the biblical tithe. He continues to say that when Christians faithfully observe the forty days of Lent they are doing the same thing with roughly a tenth of the year's days. Recall the gospel story – after Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan, he went into the wilderness and there spent 40 days "asking himself what it meant to be Jesus." Buechner insists that Lent is a time for us to do essentially the same thing – to ask ourselves, one way or another, what it means to be who we are in light of God's love. (Frederick Buechner, Wishful Thinking)

Buechner then suggests some questions that he believes assist us in discovering who we as God's creatures in this world. I share them with you as questions to ponder during Lent.:

- If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why?
- When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most like and what do you see in it that you most deplore?
- If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in twenty-five words or less?
- Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo? Which is the one that makes you happiest to remember?
- Is there any person in the world or any cause that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?
- If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

opportunity to offer 40 of our days considering questions like these about ourselves and considering who it is we might become in God's presence and love. I invite you to spend time doing so.

The church will offer several opportunities to help you along the way. Ash Wednesday begins with our White Breakfast and includes communion and the imposition of ashes. Each Sunday night during Lent we will gather in the Fellowship Hall to study the book "Forgiveness" by Marjorie Thompson. Brenda Church will lead us. On Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday we will mark Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and recall the events of that last week of his life. Each day at noon during Holy Week there will be a brief service in the sanctuary which will include scripture, prayer, and Holy Communion. We will gather in the sanctuary for a service of Tenebrae on Good Friday and mark the crucifixion of the one who comes to save. And, of course, on Easter Sunday we will celebrate Christ's victory over death and the promise that we will share in a resurrection like his.

I hope that you will be present to take part in these opportunities for study and for worship. I also hope you may spend some time on your own pondering the questions that Buechner poses. These are indeed special days for those of us who claim the faith. It is my prayer that we may do what is necessary to discover our faith and what makes life holy as we journey together. Come join us.





CHEESEBURGER SLIDERS

(Ingredients for 12 sliders)
2 lbs ground beef
1 t salt
2 t pepper
2 t garlic powder
6 slices cheddar cheese or grated cheese
12 Hawaiian Rolls (other rolls can be used)
2 T butter melted
Combine beef, salt, pepper, and garlic powder in a 9X13 rimmed baking dish, mixing thoroughly, then
pressing into a flat even layer. Bake for 20 minutes or till no longer pink. Drain liquid and set the cooked
beef aside.
Slice the rolls in half lengthwise. Place the bottom half in the same baking dish. Place the cooked beef
on the rolls, followed by the cheese. You can add chopped onions if you want. Top with the remaining roll tops.
Brush the top of the rolls with melted butter. Bake for 20 minutes or until the bread is golden
brown and the cheese is melted. Slice into individual sliders, then serve.




Lent is upon us! Scripture tells us that "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22). Many of us will seek to give something up during Lent. I often give something up as well, and agree it can be a good practice if it sets our hearts and minds more firmly on Christ. We do well to remember, however, that our God desires our obedience over our sacrifice...over our ritual...over our own religiosity. Several years ago, my good friend Janice Six presented a sermon introducing a new take on "giving up" for Lent. She encouraged us, instead of, or in addition to, "giving up" something that we "Give UP!" to God. Instead of just looking down in regret for all the ways we have failed, that we look up and recognize anew the wonderful gift of grace God has granted us. That Lenten season, she encouraged us to consider "Giving UP!" to God our praise, our worship, our thanksgiving, our whole self....rather than or in addition to "giving up" a prized item or a habit. "Giving UP!" puts a different, more positive spin on Lent. It helps us remember what it means to be sinners saved by grace...repentant, yes, but wholly aware that we are already and completely forgiven!! Hallelujah!!

To "Give UP" ourselves is to obey. God desires that we obey even more than God desires that we give up chocolate...I am just sure of it! When we obey God's Word and abide in Christ, drop our burdens, and place our whole selves into the hands of God, it is then that we are able to truly worship, to truly give thanks, and to bear good fruit for God's kingdom. There is rest, peace, and security in abiding in Christ to such a degree. So, this Lent...let's consider our willingness to look up and then "Give UP!" our very selves to God, who loves us more than we could ever imagine! Hey, could someone pass that chocolate?!?

Where is the Library?

Our Library is located in the Administration Building at 202 W. Pearl Street at the corner of Lambert Street. The parking lot is in the back and the entrance is there also. The hours are from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00P.M. Monday – Friday; if the door is locked just ring the bell and Shanna will let you in.

It is a "self-serve" Library – the instructions for checking out a book are on the table in the Library.

Books are loaned for 2 weeks and you may renew them. When you are ready to return the borrowed book put it in the box labeled for that purpose. Now you may be wondering what kind of books you will find, or you may wonder how to find a certain book. We have fiction such as the Mitford series, Miss Julia series and many other fiction books. Our Library has most of C.S. Lewis' books. We also have many Book Circle books that the Hood County Library does not have; we also have some that the HCL does have.

On our shelves are Reference books that we do allow to be signed out and other non-fiction books including some biographies. We have a good selection of children books located on the Red Cart in Fellowship Hall near the nursery. There is another cart in Fellowship Hall with Adult books. Books on the cart are rotated every month or so.

Now about finding a certain book – we have a Card Catalog which is divided - Author/Title cards are interfiled alphabetical and Subject Headings are filed separately. Just remember how we looked up a book before Libraries were computerized. Happy hunting! Our shelves are arranged as in any Library by Dewey Number. If you cannot find what you would like you may call Sheila @ 817-579-5722 and I'll try to find it or borrow it for you.

We are happy to receive donations of books you no longer want if they meet our needs or you may give a book in Honor of or in Memory of someone.

Does this sound interesting to you? We have a Library Committee that meets the third Tuesday at 1:00 August, October, January, March & May. The Committee makes decisions on book purchases.
