
Weird times we're in right now. Just weird. I must admit that I've been scared some these past many days. There. I said it: I've been scared. Or, maybe I should say that I've been worried. No, I think it's more than that. I am worried, but I also have some fear about what is going on. I don't think that's unreasonable. I've always figured that God gave us the full range of emotions and expects us to experience and know them for ourselves. I think the trick is not being undone by our emotions, not allowing our emotions to control us without reason. If that's the case, I'm not afraid to be afraid.

"Fear not!" Those words are used many times in the scriptures. They are often used in connection with Jesus and his appearances. The angel tells the shepherds not to fear when they are told that the Messiah has been born. (Lk. 2.10) Jesus calms the fears of the disciples when they see him on the waters and assume he is a ghost. (Mt. 14.27) At the tomb on Easter morning, the angel tells the women not to be afraid. (Mt. 28.5) God is present to calm our fears but God acknowledges that there are things in this world of which to be afraid. God is honest with us.

Don't forget that God comes to us – *as one of us* – in Jesus Christ. Jesus knows the human experience. In fact, "Jesus wept." (John 11.35) That's the way the King James Version renders it. It's the shortest verse in the Bible, at least in the English when translated this way. The New Revised Standard translates it as "Jesus began to weep." You'll find many variations on a theme if you consult different translations. No matter how the verse is translated, it expresses much. It is a reminder that the one we call Savior felt what we felt. It's the account of the death of Jesus' friend, Lazarus. When Jesus sees Lazarus' sisters and others crying at Lazarus' demise, he cries with them. Seeing Mary and Martha hurting causes Jesus to feel for them and to express his own sense of loss at Lazarus' death. This man Jesus felt human emotion and he cried. He is there with

us in our fear and he is present with us when we hurt because he *knows* the feeling.

The constant barrage of news stories and information about the corona virus these past weeks, amid the warnings to be careful and the alterations in our regular patterns of living, is enough to make us fearful. I get that. I feel that. But I also trust that we're not in this alone. In the words of the familiar creed: "We are not alone, we live in God's world." Those words have become a mantra to me in recent days. I repeat them as I go through my day and they have calmed my fears and have instilled in me the abiding hope and promise that we'll emerge well on the other side of this pandemic. God says so and it's God's world. I trust that.

As we go through these different and sometimes difficult days together, be reminded that we are not alone. *You* are not alone. God is with you and so are God's people. "Fear not!" the angels say. Listen to the angels. And if you need something or someone, call us. Brenda and I are here for you – and 300 fellow church members are ready to help, also. Care well for yourselves and care well for one another. We've got this thing and God is with us.


