From the pastor

Sometimes when I need a break from things, I sneak over to the sanctuary and simply sit in the quiet. It's good to be alone with one's own thoughts every now and then. Usually when I am in that space there are people all around and the sounds of preparing for worship or the words of our sacred gathering fill the air. There is normally activity in that space when the doors are open and I am thinking about what needs to be done as I direct the event.

I have a different relationship with our sanctuary when I am there on my own and my experience is changed. The sanctuary is 125 years old and we are preparing to celebrate its anniversary. Our ministry in Granbury began in 1879 but the building was completed in 1896 and the worshiping community began to gather in April of that year. In November of 1897, a formal dedication of the building was held and the mortgage was burned. Our sanctuary has been a place of worship and an identifiable mark of our congregation for 125 years now. Think of the stories and the people and the occasions that have occurred in that space over the course of those many years.

"If these walls could talk . . ." I like to ponder all that has taken place between those four walls when I spend quiet time in our sanctuary. I think about all the people that have come and gone, all those who have ascended the steps to that special building to sing praises and spiritual songs, to listen to the word read and preached, to be part of the community of faith that gathers at 303 West Bridge to worship. And in that place they have been baptized and they have been married. And in that place they have gathered for funerals to celebrate those who will gather there no more. And in that place they have been part of an ever-changing community striving to be faithful to the God who calls us. So many different faces. So many different names. So many different personalities. So many. I wonder what stories could be told if those four walls *could* talk. I wonder what stories would be told if those walls *would* talk.

Sometimes, in the silence of that room, I try to coax those stories out a bit. I listen intently to see if I might hear a tale of faith. Often my mind does wonder to a remembrance of someone I have encountered in my eight years as pastor here and the movements of his or her life that have graced and enriched our communion. But sometimes, all I hear is the old clock on the wall and the steady *tick tock* of its metronomic cadence and I remember the passing of time and the passing of personalities and the steadiness of God's presence even as the world changes all about us. That is a story in itself and I believe those walls are talking when I hear it.

There is much to celebrate in that place — 125 years of stories of faithfulness. Next time you take a seat in our sanctuary, listen to see what you can hear. You may be surprised.

Here is a good summer salad recipe on those days when it is just too hot to cook.

Asian Chicken Salad

Half big bowl of shredded cabbage (bag of cabbage/slaw mix)

2 c chicken (chopped)

1 c sliced almonds

1 c Craisens

Diced red onion (as much as you like)

1/3 cup black sesame seeds

1 loose cup cilantro leaves

Dressing: Put in food processor and blend all together

% c olive oil

1/3 c Balsamic vinegar

¼ c Soy Sauce

2 pods minced garlic (or to taste)

¼ c honey

Fresh ginger (1 ½ inch peeled)

¼ c Sesame oil

1/3 c water


