From the pastor

For the past many months we have been sharing events that celebrate the 125th anniversary of our sanctuary. Our church was chartered in 1879 but our sanctuary was completed in 1896 and the congregation began worshiping in its new home in November of that year. It was in the spring of 1897 that the mortgage was burned and a dedication for the new structure was held. We've long been a congregation that avoided debt and it was a very conscious decision to wait until the note was paid before the building was christened. We've acknowledged this time from building completion to building dedication this past year in the many events that have celebrated our shared life – a life that finds its meaning and spirit in this place of worship.

The Session's desire was to mark this time in our communal history and to celebrate the worship and ministry of our congregation. A committee was selected to plan and implement our celebration. A logo was developed with Emily Graham's help depicting *the past reaching into the future*. We chose Isaiah 54.2 as the guiding scripture of our vision for future ministry: "Enlarge the site of your tent, and let the curtains of your habitations be stretched out; do not hold back; lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes." As we celebrate our past, we hold hope that the future will bring a renewed invitation to all those who may gather in Christ's name to receive the good news of the faith. As we recall the blessings of this past, we anticipate the blessings of the future. First Presbyterian Church is a place of ministry and God's presence with us in our past ministry bodes well for the future of our work in this community and world. That is why we celebrate.

So we shared a "Pumpkin Palooza." We recalled our mission with a drive-in movie and gathered items for others. We created a memorial walk, lighting candles for each member we could identify who had graced us with their presence in this place. We gathered to sing some old hymns and to recall that the songs of the faith have taught us of God's love and have instructed us in the ways of God's grace. And, finally, we will gather for a service of worship on March 27 to conclude our celebration of the past and to mark our confidence moving into the future.

First Presbyterian Church will remain a place of ministry in the years and decades to come. God will journey with us as we continue to enlarge our tent and sing praises to God in this sanctuary. The past will be a reminder and will instruct us going forward. I am excited as we reach into the future.

Please make every effort to join us for our *grand finale* on March 27. We will all worship together at 10:00 that morning. Our guest preacher will the Rev. Dr. Ted Wardlaw, President of Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Ted is a marvelous preacher, a consummate churchman, and a very fine human being. You will appreciate his words. Following this special service of worship, we will gather in Fellowship Hall for a shared meal catered by Hard 8 Barbeque. The church will provide the meal but we do need a head count so we'll have plenty of food to share. We'll be asking you to sign up in the weeks to come. I hope that you will come – we need you present at our party!

Coming out of COVID in the life of the church seems to be a larger and more difficult but similar experience as emerging out of Snowpocalypse 2021. After Snowpocalype, we re-surfaced from under our multiple layers of blankets, stretched out our backs, and made the first pot of coffee in a very long while. We called the grandkids to ask how to reset our internet connections so we could once again interact with the outside world. As things warmed up, we began checking our pipes with prayers on our lips and in our hearts that they maintained their durability and could still contain the water that would soon be flowing freely again...flowing freely without any regard for whether the pipes had integrity or not. We praised God for bringing us through such a difficult time...even as, in some ways, we praised God for bringing us to such a difficult time. It was a time to re-prioritize life... to be thankful for the things we had taken for granted...to consider the fragile side of existence...and to re-emerge with a new vigor, even if the return began with a bit of sluggishness. It takes some time to shrug off the lethargy caused by being still for so long. When it was all said and done, we considered, with some level of grief, our losses, and then we moved forward into the promise of Spring!

As we, First Presbyterian Church of Granbury, continue to re-emerge from the isolation and difficulty of COVID-19, we face some similar feelings. We have praised God for technology that allows us to worship from our living rooms. Even still, we recognize something is missing so we leave behind our bathrobe, slippers, remote, and coffee cups to re-engage with one another in live, corporate worship. We have missed one another. We continue to reach others through technology and are so grateful to remain in contact with those who cannot come through our doors for any number of reasons.

We begin looking at the ways we used to do things. We check the pipes of our programs to make sure the important things we do as a congregation are intact and we cap off the burst pipes of programs that no longer serve us well. We repair and modify those that are beneficial but need reinforcement. We praise God for continuing to bring us through the long season of COVID. We consider anew the most important things...and cast off those not so much. We tire a bit quicker some of the time...but, still, we find we have a renewed spirit and strength having experienced and emerged from this tragedy. Even as we still deal with the grief of such a difficult time and so many losses, we hang on to the promise that Spring is on the way.

In light of that promise, now is a time for us to move forward from our unwelcome "vid-cation" and get on with the life of the church. It's going to take some work and some dedication...some conversation and re-configuration...some energy, intelligence, imagination, and agape. But, with the Holy Spirit, we have all we need.

I urge you to consider joining a committee or volunteering to help a committee. Our committees are key to the work we do in this place. We need you! We are currently beginning the planning for VBS. They say it takes a village to raise a child...I think the same is true of pulling off VBS. If you've helped before and even if you haven't, please consider engaging this year as we get VBS up and running again. Let me or Sylvia know if you can help.

Outreach and Mission

This year, we will be spotlighting some of our ongoing mission and outreach efforts, both in the newsletter and in a Minute for Mission in the Sunday service. This time it's Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Hood and Somervell Counties. CASA volunteers are trained and assigned by the courts to be riend children who are removed from their homes for protection. CASAs walk with them through their entire period of foster care until, hopefully, they find a forever home. In 2021, Hood County's 55 CASAs served 131 children from 87 families. Our support for them comes through our donation to Mission Granbury, where they clocked a combined 80,224 hours of (unpaid) service in 2021. The coming year will provide more opportunities to reach out in love to our community.

There are several people in our congregation who volunteer or volunteered in the past, this is what Saunya Bishop shared about her experience.

"I became a CASA to help the children in foster care find a safe, loving and permanent home.

As a CASA I spoke and interacted with the child to find out what they wanted. I became the voice of the child in court.

All of my 60 cases did not always end up as I hoped, but it was a very rewarding experience when the child was placed in their forever home.



HEATH BAR CAKE

Shared Recipe from Emily Holmes

1 pkg Chocolate Fudge cake mix
1 can Eagle Brand Milk
1 jar caramel ice cream topping
12 oz tub (more or less) Cool Whip

4 Heath Bars crushed or part of a package of toffee bits (in the baking aisle)
Heath bars are easier to crush if frozen; toffee bits are lots easier

Make cake according to directions on box. Bake in a 9X13" pan. While still hot, poke the top full of holes with a wooden spoon handle. Pour Eagle Brand Milk over the top then the caramel ice cream topping. REFRIGERATE OVERNIGHT. The next day spread Cool Whip on top. Sprinkle with toffee bits. YUM!!!!!
