It's amazing to me how quickly time passes. Seems as though it was only yesterday that we were in the midst of Advent and Christmas. Yet, as I write this brief message, Christmas was four months ago! Now we find ourselves fully engaged in Eastertide and our celebration is in full swing as we move toward Pentecost. The seasons of the liturgical year do come and pass quickly!

As we make our way toward the summer months when the activity of the church takes on a slower pace and we take a bit of a break from our routine, there are several events I want you to be aware of and to mark on your calendars. I hope you may make time to participate in each.

Saturday, May 7, is World Labyrinth Day. In honor of that celebration and as a way to bring awareness to our congregation about the spiritual practice of walking the labyrinth, we're going to take special note of the occasion on Sunday, May 1. We're setting up a portable labyrinth in the parking lot behind the Fellowship Hall and invite each of you to come and experience the practice. There will be sandwiches and chips and drinks to share. So join us after worship and learn a bit about labyrinths.

What is a labyrinth? A labyrinth represents a journey or path to the center and then back out into the world. It is not a maze – there is only one pathway moving in and as long as one keeps moving, he or she will find the center. It is the hope of the 125<sup>th</sup> Committee that our congregation may gift the city with a permanent labyrinth that will serve as a thank you to the community for the 143 years our church has served in this place. We've begun talks with the city to build the labyrinth in one of our parks. Join us Sunday, May 1, to learn a bit more and to experience walking the labyrinth. We're excited for this event.

Be sure to mark your calendar for the Annual Church Picnic on June 4. We'll begin at 6:00 at Ann Mitchell's (directions will be provided). The church will supply fried chicken and we'll bring the fixin's for a fine shared meal. This is always a great time to be together, to mark the coming of summer, and simply to share the fellowship of our faith community.

Speaking of summer, we will begin our summer schedule on Sunday, June 5, and follow that schedule through September 4. We will have one service each Sunday morning at 10:00 AM. This gives us an opportunity for ALL of us to worship under the same roof together. We've not had the opportunity to do that since before the pandemic. The Session thought it would be a good thing to do as we discover again what normalcy looks like around here. It will offer a little different pace for the summer months.

Lastly, I want to thank each of you for the cards and expressions of concern for my health and for the support you have given to both Rhonda and me in these past weeks. It has meant much to both of us and has reminded us how fortunate we are to do ministry in your company. I begin a new round of daily treatments next week which will require me to be out of the office quite a bit. I will work as and when I can and we'll get everything done that needs to be done. The Session and Brenda will continue to be present as they have faithfully been during this past month. Hopefully, this round of therapy will be completed in the next 6 weeks and I'll be back to full steam by early summer. Please pray for that to occur. And, again, thank you for your good care.

I was just thinking about the Prayers of the People for Sunday's worship (4/24...since we write these articles early). The Lectionary for 4/24 includes Psalm 150, the very last of the Psalms and the very last of the unique collection made up of the final five Psalms, which speak specifically about Praising God!

Each of these Psalms (146-150) begin and end with the Hebrew word Hallelujah. Hallelujah is derived from the Hebrew word Hallel...which means Praise....and Yah, which is short for the divine name Yahweh (YHWH). The focus of these five Psalms, right here at the end of this gathering of 150 Hebrew poems that we know of as the Book of Psalms, cannot be mistaken. The command is to Praise God. Praise God in the morning and in the evening. Praise God in good times and bad times. Praise God in sickness and in health. Praise God in childhood and old age. Praise God! In regard to Psalm 150, author Timothy Keller, in his excellent devotional, *The Songs of Jesus*, states:

“The psalms are, in the end, a miniature of life. Every possible experience, if prayed to the God who is really there, is destined to end in praise...If we could praise God perfectly, we would love him completely and then our joy would be full. The new heavens and new earth are perfect because everyone and everything is glorifying God fully and therefore enjoying him forever. So Psalm 150 gives us a glimpse of that unimaginable future.”

Truly this praise thing is what we are called to do. The Westminster confession, which is a part of the PC(USA) Book of Confessions, begins with the question: “What is the chief end of man?” and the answer: “...to glorify God and to enjoy him forever.” So, when we “Hallel Yah,” we honor God and fulfill the very reason we were created!

As we continue along this Eastertide season, may we be found glorifying God...and in our glorifying of God, may we receive God's joy...enjoyment...FOREVER. I invite you to take a look at the Hallel Yah Psalms (146-150). I'll even leave you with Psalm 150, right here.

Praise the Lord.  
Praise God in his sanctuary;  
praise him in his mighty heavens.  
2 Praise him for his acts of power;  
praise him for his surpassing greatness.  
3 Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet,  
praise him with the harp and lyre,  
4 praise him with timbrel and dancing,  
praise him with the strings and pipe,  
5 praise him with the clash of cymbals,  
praise him with resounding cymbals.  
6 Let everything that has breath praise the Lord.  
Praise the Lord.

We delivered 39 hams, 30 gift bags for children, 24 for dogs and 12 for cats to the housing authority residents and employees.

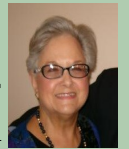
We delivered 12 dog gift bags and 12 cat gift bags to the senior center to go out to the meals on wheels recipients.

### Key Lime Pie

Purchase a Graham Cracker Crust.

Make filling: 8 oz cream cheese softened, 1 can Eagle Brand Milk  
1/2 cup lime juice ( you can squeeze limes or use bottled lime juice), 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla

Use a mixer to beat the cream cheese till fluffy, then add the other ingredients and mix till smooth. Pour into the Graham Cracker Crust. Put pie in the refrigerator for at least 4 hours or in the freezer. You can put Cool Whip on the top if you like it or just serve it plain.

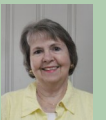

As the Elder over Christian Education, I'm quickly learning the different facets of my job and the need for the many parts that make up the whole of Christian Education. Our committee deals with Sunday School, the Nursery, Bible studies for both Men and Women, Vacation Bible School, our Library and more.

Our congregation embodies the tradition of Christian faith and, communicates the meaning of faith to the next generation by the way we worship and live together. Education is not indoctrination, but teaching all ages how to practice what it means to be a Christian.
