From the pastor

When we were kids, we played a lot of "guessing" games. We played them in various ways. Sometimes, we played them in the guise of knock-knock jokes. You remember: "Knock, knock," says one of you. "Who's there?" says the other. "Jimmy," says the one. "Jimmy who?" says the other. "Jimmy the door and I'll let you in," the jokester would say. I never thought that was a very good one, but my buddy Paul thought it was hilarious, and he told it to anyone who would listen. I think it must have been a joke of his own creation.

We would often play "20 Questions" on long road trips with the family. The player whose turn it was would think up a particular item, and the others in the car were allowed to ask questions, each one taking turns until they either guessed the item or asked the 20 questions and failed to figure it out. The first question was usually, "Is it living or dead?" or maybe, "Is it vegetable or mineral?" Someone would almost always ask, "Is it larger than a bread box?" Goodness, how many folk today would even get that reference? Everyone would think and ask and ask and think. The best players in the car were the ones who listened to all the answers to all the questions and were able to put together a good guess based on all the clues offered. They didn't just listen to the answers to their questions, they listened to *all* the questions and *all* the answers and developed a composite answer.

I know many of us are now playing WORDLE on our computers and phones. It's a guessing game. The object is to guess the word. Each word has five letters. You have six guesses in which to find the correct word. A new word is offered online at midnight each day. It's a game intended to be played individually so that the only competition is with one's self. However, there is now apparently a version intended to be played competitively with others. I enjoy playing it each morning, and I've learned a thing or two along the way. I've also learned that most of the words I know are six letter words!

I read a brief piece recently suggesting that religion is little more than a guessing game. I didn't find much in the article that I agreed with. Can we answer all the questions of the universe in religious parlance with any great degree of surety? Perhaps not. But we can ask questions and learn. We can listen to one another and hear what is being said. We can study the scriptures and dig more deeply in order to understand their context. We can gather all the clues we can in order to appropriate what we know from our religious traditions and how they may inform our world today. Surely our prayers and our worship instruct us in this venture. Sometimes we do guess but hopefully we make informed guesses as we do. In the end, it's not whether we make 6 attempts or 20 attempts that matters. It's not a competition. We figure out what this faith is all about when we discover that He who stands at the door and knocks is the One who calls us to faith. I don't think that's guess work – I think we can rely on that. It is by God's grace that we are called "children of God." And so we are. That's not just guesswork.

Stephen Ministry Is Coming!

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." – John 15:12

On Wednesday of my very first week among you, I attended choir practice – not to sing, of course (whew!!) ...just to meet people and to learn more about the music ministry at our church. I wasn't in the sanctuary for more than 2 minutes, when out of the choir loft flew...yes, she flew...a beautiful lady. She had a look of loving urgency on her face as she grabbed me by the shirt and exclaimed, "I have been waiting for you!" I accepted her hug and wondered why it was she had been waiting for me. She continued, "You are going to be the one to bring Stephen Ministry to our church!" It wasn't a question. It wasn't even a statement. This was a true proclamation! One I certainly couldn't refuse.

That was the first week of January, 2020. In March of that year, at the very beginning of Covid, that dear lady, Ruth Ann, succumbed to cancer and passed away, but not before we had met at least three times. Even in her last days of fighting her disease, Ruth Ann was seeking assurance that I had my marching orders and understood my mission. I promised her that we would get Stephen Ministry started in our congregation. Ruth Ann provided a generous donation to the church to cover the initial expenses...All was ready...

Then, Covid...

Fast forward to 2022. Now, as we have emerged from the pandemic, it is time to follow through on my promise. And I am beyond excited to get started.

What is Stephen Ministry? The official answer states: "Stephen Ministry offers a proven and effective way to organize, equip, and supervise a team of congregation members—called *Stephen Ministers*—to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community experiencing life difficulties." Said another way, Stephen Ministry is a way for lay people to be trained to "listen, listen...love, love." A trained Stephen Minister is paired up with another person who is in a season of difficulty. Stephen Ministry provides people just like you with the tools needed to confidentially serve another person in our congregation.

Last month, we registered our church as a Stephen Ministry church and paid the initial fee. The next step is sending two people to Stephen Leader training. Once trained, those Stephen Leaders will be equipped to lead the classes necessary for church members to become Stephen Ministers. Those who complete Stephen Ministry training will be officially installed as Stephen Ministers and will be, prayerfully, paired up with a person who has a need.

I feel confident that many of you will step up to be Stephen Ministers. And, as Presbyterians, we are often more willing *to help* than *to be helped*. So, it is our hope anyone who has a need will be willing to accept a Stephen Minister...someone to simply listen, encourage, and be present. We truly are better together. We are called to bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:2), and Stephen Ministry is a wonderful way for us to do just that, one for another.

I wish we could re-name our church's Stephen Ministry. I like the ring of Ruth Ann's Ministry. But I guess there are probably rules against that. Still, my heart is happy to, finally, be able to begin to implement this ministry that was so near and dear to one as near and dear as Ruth Ann was to us.


