Believe it or not, things do change around the church. We're about to experience change as a congregation when Brenda Church moves to San Angelo to accept a new call to service. She brought ideas and different perspectives on the way we do business. She provided worship leadership and was a presence when we gathered as a community on Sunday mornings. I know well that I will miss the relief she provided me in several ministry tasks. I am particularly grateful for her leadership during these past months when my health prevented me from being 100%. Grateful indeed.

On Sunday, July 31, we'll hold a congregational meeting after worship and the congregation will vote to request Grace Presbytery to dissolve the pastoral relationship between this congregation and Brenda Church effective August 12. That action allows her to be transferred to and received by Tres Rios Presbytery to begin her work in San Angelo. Hold Brenda in prayer as she embarks upon this new ministry. She is excited by this offering in ministry and I know she's ready to hit the ground running. It's a big change for her.

After the congregational meeting on Sunday, I hope you'll join us in Fellowship Hall for some cake and punch as we celebrate Brenda's time here. It will be a good time for you to express your appreciation to her and say "thanks" for her ministry in our midst. We'll be different without her.

What happens next? The Session will have a discussion about staffing patterns going forward and we'll make those decisions after we do some study and thinking and visioning about the future. It's a good opportunity for us to do a little reconnoitering. We'll keep you posted on that conversation.

Yes, things do change even around the church. I've got to believe that change is an opportunity for growth. And the good news is that God is with us through it all. I'm beyond grateful for that.

hristian stewardship is about establishing priorities. Knowing that God created our world and everyone and everything in it is the foundation of our understanding and acceptance of Christian stewardship. As scripture tells us, *"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and all those who live in it."* (Psalm 24:1 NRSV)

All that we have and all that we are as individuals are gifts from God. The gifts that we have been blessed with include not only our belongings, property, and money, but also our time, our character traits, our intelligence, our creativity, our special skills and talent, our interpersonal strengths, and any other facets of our lives that we may possess. Small Group Dinners : We have a group of members and friends of the church who are participating in small group dinners this summer. We will start another group in September for the fall. Get-togethers can be dinner, breakfast, brunch, or lunch in your home or at a restaurant, whatever works best for you and your group. They are a wonderful way to get to know each other! Sign-up will be in the narthex by mid-August.

Here is a nice summer pasta salad that feeds a bunch.

Vermicelli Salad (20-25 people) 2 boxes (yellow) Fideo or bag of Vermicelli – cooked and cover for 5 minutes only 4 T salad oil 3 T lemon juice 1 T Accent (this is MSG – suit yourself about adding it. I usually add it)

Mix these 4 ingredients and let sit overnight.

The next day add: ¹/₂ c chopped onion 1 c green pepper chopped 1 c celery chopped 1 c ripe olives chopped (optional) 1 large can chopped pimentos

Mix it all together with ³/₄ pint of mayonnaise or until moistened .

Hint to make mixing it easier, I use a spaghetti server to rake through the overnight mixture. It tends to stick together, and you have to get it separated before adding the vegs. Just rake across the top until it is loose.
