What happened so far?

The team was selected (Linda Allen, Nancy Bennett, Emily Graham, Darin Smith, and Jim Wallis) and briefed on the scope and responsibilities by a representative of Session (Connie Darne') and Grace Presbytery Committee on Ministry (Rev. Dr. Michael Waschevski).

What is our first task?

We will undergo a comprehensive reflection upon the history of our church, review its current status, and set the direction for the future of the congregation in all the areas of church life and the community we serve.

How will we do the work?

We will invest time in: congregational reflection, gathering and analyzing data (demographics, financial information, church programs and activities, etc.) and envisioning the future of the congregation and its ministries.

How long will it take to produce the Mission Study Report?

We have just begun, so we do not have a firm *when will it be done answer*. We have a detailed checklist for the work ahead, and the time it takes varies by congregation

How will we communicate with the congregation?

We will communicate in every possible way we can, and as often as we can, in whatever medium available. We assure you the communication will be 2-way. Your engagement in the process is the ultimate lynchpin to learning who God is calling and names as our new Pastor.



Just as Jesus withdrew to the Judean wilderness for 40 days and nights of prayer and fasting (Matthew 4:1-11), we are called to follow His example so that we, too, may overcome the darkness in our lives.

As we enter the Season of Lent, perhaps it's a good time of the year to reflect on the importance of our Christian stewardship principles and how we can best put them into practice. Christian stewardship is an integral element of faith for all those who have responded to the invitation of Jesus to follow Him. It underscores the psalmist's affirmation that "the earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and all those who live in it." (Psalm 24:1)

So what does this mean in our life of faith? If we believe that our time, talents, and treasures have come from God and must be administered faithfully as God would have us do, then we are by extension functioning as stewards in God's domain. This is true for all of us as individuals and also collectively for us as a congregation.

A simplified definition of Christian stewardship might be expressed as the manner in which we care and use the gifts God has entrusted to us employing ways and means that serve God's purposes. This simplified definition includes such things as helping our brothers and sisters in need, caring for the environment that God created, managing our own health, and tending and nurturing our interpersonal relationships, among a host of many other examples. Christian stewards might be asked by



God on their judgment day, "How well did you manage the gifts I bestowed upon you?" Will you be able to confidently answer this question?




FUN CIRCLE

Cinnamon Bubble Bread

Rhodes frozen dinner rolls (regular size, not Texas size) Spray Bundt pan well with Pam Place 11 frozen dinner rolls on bottom of pan Place 12-13 rolls in next row

Add Topping:

1 small box Butterscotch pudding (not instant)

1 cup brown sugar

Chopped pecans and/or raisons if desired

2 t cinnamon mixed with ½ cup sugar (add next to last)

1 stick melted butter (last)



Put in cold oven overnight with a cookie sheet under it for overflow. Next morning, bake for 30 minutes at 350. Let it rest 15 minutes in pan, then turn out onto big enough plate to catch the sauce. (Place plate on top of Bundt pan and invert quickly so as not to drip sauce). This is great when you have company and need an easy breakfast.
