#### The Next Step

On April 29, the Mission Study Committee met for a full day to discuss, organize, and draw conclusions from the data we gathered in our congregational meetings, the community demographics we researched, our historical membership data, and our compiled information about the programs and activities of our church.

The Mission Study Committee hopes to have their report ready for the Session to review at their regular May meeting. In addition to Session approval, the report must also be approved by Grace Presbytery.

#### But When Do We Get A Pastor?

There's no easy answer to this question. Once the Mission Study Report is complete, the Pastor Nominating Committee will begin their work. Please be patient as each step is carefully and thoughtfully completed. The volunteers on these committees are taking special care to do their part in the process of finding the right Pastor to serve at First Presbyterian Church.

#### The Meetings

The Mission Study Committee held three sessions for congregational input.

About 45 members were present to voice their opinions in these meetings.

#### **Communion Guild Volunteers Needed**

Preparing the sacraments for communion is a wonderful way to serve God and our congregation. It does not require much of a time commitment. Each month Communion Guild members prepare Communion and clean up after the service. The preparation is usually done the day before in the Memorial Hall Sacristy. Communion is usually done the first Sunday of the month and happens more often in the months when Christmas and Easter occur. We need two guild members to sign up for each month. Training and written instructions are provided. The next training session is scheduled for May 6<sup>th</sup>.

We all have problems and challenges, and sometimes they feel like more than we can handle... But with God's help we can endure more than we think we can. When we look around, we see others who have worse problems.

I was very inspired by the story in the Hood County News of a 16-year-old high school student, Trevor Vossler. He was seriously injured in an automobile accident that resulted in the amputation of both legs. His upbeat attitude and faith in God are helping him cope and persevere. He has a long road ahead, but he expects to return to a very active life.

I know of others with physical challenges. Bev McKusick's grandson, C.J. Cluck, lost part of his leg due to cancer. With his prosthesis he plays soccer, and he recently went roller skating. Justin Rarick, an elementary student at the school where I worked, was born with no arms. One leg is shorter than the other, so he wore a prosthetic leg. He wrote with his feet and was able to play the drums. Our neighbor, in his late 70s, lost part of his leg a few years ago. You wouldn't know it to see him walk unless you saw his prosthesis. It doesn't keep him from working constantly in his vard.

Dear God, when we have challenges and problems, help us realize some people have worse problems than we do. And if we experience severe challenges, help us remember that, with your help, others have gone through and adjusted well to some very serious circumstances. With your help, we will be able to handle our challenges also. Thank you for always being there to help us. In Christ's name, Amen.

Hope everyone enjoys the beautiful springtime weather.




















he Christian Education Committee is working hard on many projects.

Changes are coming for *Vacation Bible School*. The members of the CE Committee have agreed that we need







1/3 c Balsamic vinegar

1/4 c Soy Sauce

2 pods minced garlic (or to taste)

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c honey

Fresh ginger (1 ½ inch peeled)

1/4 c Sesame oil

1/3 c water
