



Key Lime Pie

Purchase a Graham Cracker Crust or make your own


Filling: 8 oz softened cream cheese ½ cup lime juice (you can squeeze limes or use bottled lime juice) 1 can Eagle Brand Milk ½ teaspoon Vanilla

Use a mixer to beat the cream cheese till fluffy, then add the other ingredients and mix till smooth. Pour into the Graham Cracker Crust. Put pie in the refrigerator for at least 4 hours or in the freezer. You can put Cool Whip on the top if you like it or just serve it plain.


