3 T soy sauce

Bake at 325 till very hot. I have also microwaved this and also heated it in a large saucepan with the sauce. Add the bacon later or omit it.

November is a month when we give thanks and gratitude, both as Americans and as followers of Christ. Our national holiday of Thanksgiving occurs on the fourth Thursday of November each year. This holiday is modeled on the first harvest feast shared in the year 1621 by the English Pilgrim colonists in Plymouth, Massachusetts and the local native people. This holiday is rich in legend and symbolism, and in the early years the colonists became accustomed to regularly celebrating days of Thanksgiving with feasts and prayers thanking God for His blessing of freedom from tyranny, end of droughts, and harvests of sufficiency. This tradition has continued in our country from those early days until contemporary times when American families come together to give thanks and celebrate with the traditional meal of turkey, bread stuffing, potatoes, cranberries, and pumpkin pie, followed by the day long watching of parades and football games.



As Christians we also use the Thanksgiving season as a time to thank God for the many gifts and blessings, He has bestowed upon each of us. When we grasp the magnitude of these gifts and blessings, we cannot help but be thankful for His goodness and mercy. In giving thanks to God, we are reminded of how deeply loved we are by the Lord.

Safety Team

Since adoption of the Emergency Preparedness Plan by the Session in June 2022, a lot has happened in the area of Safety at First Presbyterian Granbury. This article will talk about our progress in several different areas. Some of these have been mentioned in the past but may be new information to our newest members.

OFF DUTY POLICE OFFICERS: On Sunday September 17th 2023, we had our first uniformed Off-duty officer present for our 9 a.m. Sunday school and 10 a.m. main service. This program relies on having officers of either Granbury PD or the Hood Cty Sheriff's office volunteer for this duty through their respective departments. In the event no officer volunteers for a particular date, then we will not have an officer present on that date. Participating officers work closely with members of the Safety Team to maximize their effectiveness, and it's been gratifying to hear the positive comments expressed to the officer by those departing services. Finally, funds to pay for this service came through a generous contribution from a church member.

SECURITY FOR THE CHILDREN: Recently a hallway door was installed to enhance the security of our children's classrooms in Fellowship Hall. In addition, adults working with the children can now communicate directly with safety team personnel via radio.

CHOKING PREVENTION KITS: The church recently purchased two kits designed to help prevent accidental choking. Training on the use of these units will be conducted by the Safety Team in Fellowship Hall immediately after the 10:00 service on Oct. 22 and 29th. All are welcome to attend this training.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION: A practice Emergency Evacuation of the Sanctuary occurred on May 21, 2023. This evacuation was an exercise to test a plan for the real event. We learned a great deal from your wonderful cooperation and feedback. Thank you! We will incorporate what we learned in our next practice drill.

The preparation for the evacuation exercise began many months earlier. A written evacuation plan was developed by your safety team. Our own Terry Worcester, a professional in the field of fire and emergency response, enabled the engagement of the Granbury Fire Department to review our facilities and plan which resulted in the Evacuation Maps found in sanctuary pews. Clearly, your continued interest, questions, suggestions, and comments are part of on-going preparation. For example, if you have a mobility concern/question regarding your personal evacuation, we want you to express that concern/question directly to a safety team member. Knowing specifics helps to do the right thing for you in emergency situations.

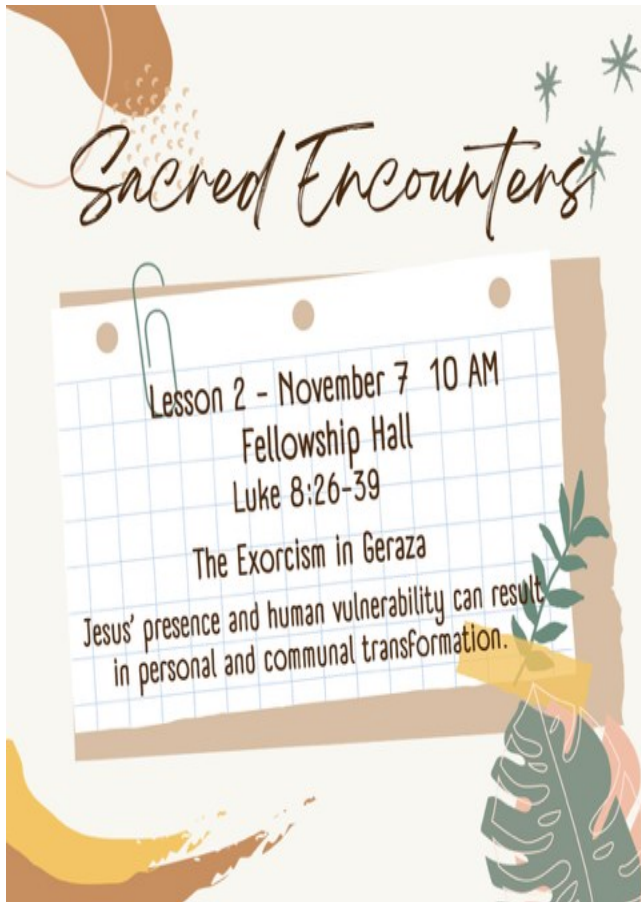
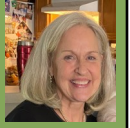
EQUIPMENT: The infrastructure supporting our safety efforts includes a security room in Fellowship Hall manned with trained personnel and equipped with a large screen monitoring 15 separate views of the church campus, a NOAA weather radio, multiple two-way radios used by Safety Team members, Automated External Defibrillator (AED) machines, and Red Emergency Bags located in the Sanctuary, Fellowship Hall, Memorial Hall, and the Administration building.

TRAINING: At the core of preparation for an emergency is TRAINING. In September 2022, CPR/ STOP THE BLEED training was completed by 14 members. In November 2022 a campus-wide Threat Analysis was completed by the Granbury PD. Then in February 2023, CRASE (Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events) training was provided by Granbury PD. As mentioned above, our next training session will cover the new Choking Prevention devices.

CONCLUSION: Safety Team members wear a special yellow name badge for many different Reasons, not the least of which is to be readily recognizable to worshippers. So, pick us out of the crowd as we welcome your suggestions and/or questions. Yes, we all are on the team as we do our part, play our role, and engage in this great fellowship of our congregation.

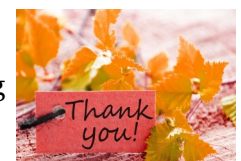

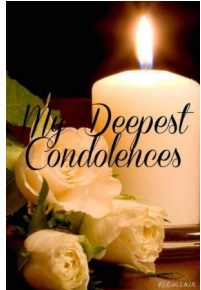

Mission Spotlight: Granbury Housing Authority

Public Housing was established to provide decent, safe, and sanitary rental housing for eligible low-income families, the elderly, and persons with disabilities. The Granbury Housing Authority (GHA) is committed to promoting adequate and affordable housing, economic opportunity, and a suitable living environment free from discrimination. The (GHA) is governed by a locally appointed Board of Commissioners (appointed by the mayor) and funded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). GHA owns 100 units in duplex and four-flex styles that are intermingled in the neighborhoods located on the following streets in Granbury: Crockett, Rucker, Houston, Travis, Thrash, Baker, Barton, Live Oak, and Mill. Units range in size from efficiencies, one bedroom, two bedrooms, and three bedrooms.

FPC Granbury has actively pursued outreach to the GHA residents for approximately six years. This past year we provided Easter baskets to all the children and hams to 48 families for Easter dinner. In April, we took requests and prepared and planted flower beds for five residents. In October, we coordinated with the North Central Texas Area Agency on Aging for a Benefits Counselor to come to the Housing Authority and speak to the residents about the various Medicare programs and updates for 2024. Approximately 25 residents attended the workshop. Following the meeting, the Outreach & Mission Committee provided a light lunch for those attending. The presentation was very informative and several attendees were able to speak to the Benefits Counselor about individual concerns and questions.



As we approach the Holiday Season, FPC's outreach to the Housing Authority will provide Thanksgiving turkey and side dishes, along with an Advent Calendars for the children and puzzle books for adults. **On November 5, we will be holding a Wreath-Making workshop in Fellowship Hall immediately after the 10:00 service. Please come and join us.** I believe it will be a fun and fulfilling time. The beautiful Christmas wreaths will be given to the GHA residents. Our Christmas gift to the Housing Authority residents includes a ham, soup-in-a-jar, and a Christmas gift bag. If you would like to contribute items for the gift bags, we will need them by **December 10th**. You can choose from the following items:

- * Kitchen dish towels, dish cloths, and/or potholders
- * 10 - 15 oz cans of mixed nuts
- * Hot chocolate mix - (packets of mix work best)
- * Popcorn tins

On Wednesday, December 13 at 10:00 a.m. we will be assembling the Christmas gift bags. We welcome everyone who wishes to help us that morning.



There will be a basket in the narthex to collect donations after Thanksgiving. If you prefer that we do the shopping, we will also be grateful for cash donations. You may put your check in the Sunday offering with a notation: Christmas gift bag. I cannot begin to tell you how many GHA residents have expressed their thanks for all the things our Church does for them. It is truly appreciated. We will be distributing the Thanksgiving food on November 16, and the Christmas bags on December 19. We do ask residents sign-up in advance for the turkeys and hams, so we know how many to buy. We are currently estimating 78 individuals, and 15 families with a total of 25 children.

Other Outreach & Mission News: The next Habitat for Humanity lunch is Wednesday, November 15, 2023. A sign-up sheet for casseroles, desserts, and salads will be in the narthex on Sunday, November 5 and 12. If you can help with this, you should have your ready-to-serve dish in the church office by 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, November 15. We will pick-up the food, serve the lunch on-site, and bring your container back to the church office that afternoon. Thank you again for your support of this program.
