

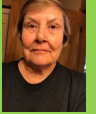

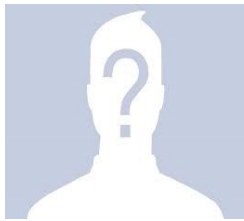

I would love for everyone to wear green that night and we'll do an Irish themed potluck. If you don't have an Irish recipe, just bring whatever you would like. The other events in March are Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. On Easter Sunday, starting at 9am, we will be serving breakfast pastries, coffee and juice in Fellowship Hall. So be sure to join us for that Easter fellowship. We will also be putting flowers on the cross out in front of the sanctuary. If you can, please bring flowers to put on the cross. I love filling the cross with flowers every year. It is a beautiful church tradition. We have people drive by every year to enjoy the beauty of it.

The recipe this month is one I made a lot in the past but for some reason just stopped making it. It's easy to make and is a great addition to any meal, especially soup.

## BEER BREAD

3 c. of all-purpose flour  
1 tbsp. of baking powder  
1 tbsp. Kosher salt  
1/4 c. granulated sugar  
12 oz. beer  
1/2 c. unsalted butter, melted

### Optional ingredients:

1 c. shredded cheddar, caramelized onions, bacon bits, jalapenos...



In a large bowl, sift together flour, baking powder salt, and sugar. Add the beer and 1/4 cup of melted butter. Stir to combine, and then fold in any optional ingredients.

Pour the batter into the prepared pan and smooth the surface with a spatula. Pour the remaining 1/4 c. of melted butter on top.

Bake the bread for 1 hour or until golden brown at 375 degrees. Check the loaf with a toothpick, when it comes out clean, remove from the oven and allow the bread to cool in the pan for 5 to 10 minutes. Invert it to finish cooling. Enjoy.

**FUN CIRCLE:** On March 27<sup>th</sup> we're taking a road trip to the Cowgirl Hall of Fame followed by lunch at Lucille's BBQ. Depending on time, we may even visit the Montgomery Street Antique Mall. We will be leaving the church at 9 am that day, and I'm not sure of the return time. Please let me know if you plan to go so that I can determine how many cars we will need. I also need to know if you would be willing to drive. I've never been to the Cowgirl Hall of Fame, so I'm really excited to go. Hope you are too.

**SPRING RUMMAGE SALE:** Spring is in the air (almost), and it's time to start your spring cleaning. It is perfect timing since our spring rummage sale is coming up quickly. Here are some dates to put on your calendars. Sunday April 7<sup>th</sup> we will be doing our setup after church.
