Session Spiritual Leaders met for their regularly scheduled meeting on June 20. The Spiritual Leaders invoked Christ's presence into the meeting by lighting a candle and sharing joys and concerns/pits and cherries. Session Spiritual Leaders were led on a Spiritual Formation Exercise by Rev. Madden Scott on the topic of "Transformational Leaders Embrace Change and Discomfort." Leader were given homework to discern where transformation is happening and where the Spirit is inviting us to possess a stronger sense of urgency for radical change.

- Session acknowledged a generous trust disbursement of \$425,000 from Jack and Ruby Walters' Family Trust and Estate: gifted to FPC.
- Cane's Chicken gave a generous donation of 'Kids' Meals Free Passes' to the Vacation Bible School of FPC Granbury.
- Session Spiritual Leaders will acknowledge the gifts from the Walters and Cane's Chicken.
- A decision was made to have the paid team/staff who serve the church report to the Pastor as Head of Staff, and she will work alongside of the Administration Team.
- Nursery Care Attendants will be sought through advertising to begin positions in late summer or early fall.
- Lawson Allen and Mylene Bole have been authorized as assistant treasurers to perform the offertory collection counting duties of the treasurer when the Treasurer is unavailable.
- Online Bill Pay will be set up by the Treasurer.
- Upcoming Presbytery Meeting dates: September 21 and December 5
- \$1730 additional funds were allocated to send any child/youth to camp.
- The Admin Team and Pastor will begin advertising and recruiting for paid Nursery Care Attendants.

After that: stock broker, bank broker, and lastly,

following his passion for antiques and history, he began collecting, selling, and finally offering items for auction on eBay at its height. He started Antique Retriever LLC.

Rev. Angela and Jack met while she was in dental sales. She rebuffed him, wouldn't speak to him on the phone. So he developed a great telephone friendship with Angela's mother, who convinced Angela to date him. Not afraid to follow their dreams and impulses after prayerful consideration, they sold everything, and Angela entered Louisville Seminary.

The Madden Scott family includes 15 year old son Major and the Golden Retriever Monk and Callie the calico cat.



#### Thank you, Jack & Ruby for the Endowment to FPC Granbury

Jack Walters was soft spoken, kind and grandfatherly. If you questioned, listened, and really were interested, he would delve into the past and reveal some of his life stories. During WWII, in the islands, Jack was taken as a prisoner of war. Jack was beaten and barely given enough food to survive. Jack, to my recollection, stood at about 6'2". After being rescued at the end of the war, he weighed only 89 pounds.

Ruby Walters was a petite, quiet woman with a charming sense of humor and was a true lady. She was brought up in an orphanage and never knew her parents. Ruby and Jack married after the war. They deeply loved and respected each other, but never had any children of their own and had no other family,



Neither Ruby or Jack had any religious training or affiliation in the 1980's. Dorothy Campbell (our social butterfly) encouraged them to come to our church. From the first day they attended, they felt God's loving call and one could actually see the change in their lives and the depth of their faith. As older adults, Jack and Ruby were baptized and became members of the First Presbyterian Church of Granbury. They attended church regularly where friendships and bonds were formed.

Years later, Jack and Ruby moved away and we lost touch. This week, the Granbury church was contacted by the lawyers from their estate. Jack and Ruby left close to half a million dollars to our church. Were we not just reminded of the parable of the mustard seed? How will we use this contribution to grow our faith and our church, to open the doors for those seeking or those in need? Jack and Ruby found the love of Christ while attending First Presbyterian. May God guide us to use this endowment to further his kingdom on earth. Thank you Jack and Ruby!
