PSL...doesn't mean what you think it does!!!

Dear Faith Family,

One of my favorite things, about *my least favorite activity* (grocery shopping), is unloading the wheeled cart and then pushing it with as much force, gusto and possibility as I can muster across the parking lot to the cart racks. I send that cart sailing and it feels awesome. Most of the time the cart makes it into the 'stall.'

For if you... "Keep your eyes open. Keep each other's spirits up so that no one falls behind or drops out" (Message, Ephesians 6: 10-20) what will be the impact on the world?



What actions of the heart fill you up and fill up God's kingdom around you? What is on your Bucket List? Does everyone in your family have a bucket list? A bucket list is a list of dreams that you want to experience or realize to fill your heart and make your heart sing? Perhaps that's the most appropriate question of spiritual health and balance...what makes your heart sing?

I have a long bucket list and I keep adding to it.

A few of the primary things on my bucket list: see every continent (I have seen 4) and the last 7 states which I have not seen. View the northern lights in Iceland. Watch the whales lazily, while Major plays on the beach on the San Juan islands off the coast of Washington state. Hike the Appalachian Trail from start to finish. Take a pilgrimage walk in Spain on the famous *Camino*.

Ponder that you are the only you that God created.

Remember that you don the garments and bear the face of Christ.

Wear Christ's heart and let your heart show strength to the world.

Let the Spirit pour out of you the drops of kindness, compassion, love, forgiveness, grace and peace. The Ephesians' exhortation in Chapter 6 to "be strong" carries with it in English a fairly active connotation, inferring a "shape up" or even "get strong" admonition.

Have you slacked off this summer?

Our spiritual aerobics are about as weak as the exercise routine of the man who described his early morning calisthenics in this fashion: "I have to talk to myself when I awaken. I say -- 'Ready, now. Up -- down, up -- down.' After two strenuous minutes I tell myself: 'O.K. Now -- try the other eyelid."' It's the season to be filled up and renewed again in Christ. It's time again to 'wake up' and 'fill up' in worship and then, share that bucket with the world.

Our faith in Christ and our trust in God must be shared.

Our attitude of repentance and turning to Christ is a message that must not be kept to ourselves: the blessings of our faith must continue to flow. Think about PSL, and not Pumpkin Spice Lattes, **Presbyterians Show and Share Love.** Evangelism is not a dirty word. 70 million Americans are un-churched. 70 million Americans have never been introduced to the **single-greatest gift**: the gift of Jesus Christ. 1 out of 4 people in America have said that they would like to know God, would like to have the support of a church—if they were just asked. "A trusted measure of religiosity over the decades has been church attendance and, for the most part, Americans are attending church less," according to Barna's new research. (Being a Contagious Christian, Willow Creek Association)

God expects us to be effective in bringing unchurched and unbelieving people to faith in Jesus Christ.

Active church membership in the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. continues to decline. In 2018, membership in PCUSA churches dropped by just over 62,000 folks (August 23, 2019 PCUSA press release, Rev. James Herbert Nelson Stated Clerk). Presbyterian churches average only 1 baptism per

year. This faith family has been blessed to celebrate a recent adult baptism and 6 child baptisms so far in 2024. We have also been blessed that God has loaned us 9 new members since June 2024.

What if twenty steps across a room could change someone's life forever? What if the Holy Spirit gave you a fresh appreciation for the Holy Spirit's mysterious ways of working through you to rekindle your passion for people? What if the Holy Spirit revived your belief that the single greatest gift you can give to your friends and family members is an introduction to the God who created them, the God who loves them, and the God who has a purpose for their every day lives?

September 29 is Evangelism Emphasis Sunday! Let's pack the pews with friends and neighbors and strangers who help us to shake up Jesus' love in the world!

The Session Spiritual Leaders met on August 20 for their regularly called meeting! Their docket was designed as Work as Worship. Each Elder had a time of sharing in a Spiritual Formation exercise and devotion. Highlights of motions approved...

- *Consecration Sunday will be held November 10 with a Catered meal. The Theme is "Sharing Brings JOY to us. To others. To God" come home to FPC for a Home-cooked meal and Taste and See that God is Good.
- * November 17 will be a Congregational Meeting to elect elders for the Session
- * January 18, 2025 will be the date for all current and newly elected Spiritual Leaders to have Leadership Training (9 am to 1 with breakfast served at 8:30 a.m. and an Italian Lunch at Noon).
- * January 12, 2025 Congregational Meeting
- * October 20, 2024 Children's Sabbath Sunday
- * Memorial Hall will house all plaques in HONOR of and in MEMORIAL of individuals and organizations of the church
- * A painting of Jesus Christ from an Arizona artist was received
- * The Administrative Assistant will receive a new ergonomic desk
- * Jessica Roberson was hired as Lead Nursery Attendant Employee
- * The two-adult rule for the Nursery has been waived until such time as the Assistant Nursery Attendant is hired. The church Security Room is staffed with an adult. Session also notes that the Nursery Attendant adult is given a security device each Sunday and parents have access to a church pager
- * The Session performed an annual review of the Child Protection Policy for FPC
- * The Session performed an annual review of the Privacy Policy for FPC
- * The Treasurer elected annually by Session will be given his/her own office at the church admin building
- * Minutes for Mission will be offered more often in worship by individuals and teams of the church to share the stories of what is happening
- * The Session approved the updated Personnel Policy
- * The Session received the resignation of Emily Graham from Internet Technology duties noting that she indicates she has had 2 children since embarking on this position and no longer has time for the duties! She will be honored during worship on 9/1! Her article illustrating the history of live streaming at FPC will be shared in the Bridge Newsletter.
- * Priscilla Allen, Janet Everitt, Emily Graham, Marijane Harvey, Jane Seley, Nancy Worcester all have anniversaries/start date and will be honored and celebrated in worship on September 1, 2024
- * The Session received communication from several willing IT volunteers: Bianca Brownfield, Pat Luley, and Gail Deckert! These volunteers will learn the pre-Sunday morning IT duties and perform these until such time as Session determines a company to outsource to or, next steps! There is room for more to volunteer to learn the 'pre-Sunday' IT duties and the 'Sunday camera volunteer duties.' Two opportunities to volunteer! Appreciation is given to Bianca, Pat and Gail!
- * Winter VBS will be held January 6-10, 2025
- * Session appointed Elder Kathy Long as the Confirmation Sponsor for Major E. Scott
- * Session approved the curriculum Growing in Grace and Gratitude for children and youth
- * In the Spring, the Session began to dream about the Usher Elder Position and making it an "Internet Technology Elder" position! At this meeting, the Session approved renaming the Usher Elder as the Elder for Evangelism and Youth Ministry beginning in January 2025 and the Session will be seeking avenues for volunteers and outsourcing of the Internet Technology duties namely the Website maintenance, advertising, social media marketing, and Livestreaming of Worship!

FPC Granbury Live Stream: A History

The first live streamed service was Sunday, March 3, 2019. (Three days before I gave birth to Elliott!) I did a live stream of the service using my cell phone, with a little phone holder that clamped onto the end of the church pew. There was no zoom, only a physical pan/tilt by hand, and no amplification of the sound, other than what you could hear from the speakers in the sanctuary.

This was just a trial, but several watched as it streamed live. I did this again on Easter Sunday, and then again in August and September of 2019, the services were streamed in this manner. Starting in October, we were able to stream with our current setup. An outside company installed the remote-controlled camera in the sanctuary, wired the video from the camera, and sound from the soundboard, underground, and into the Session Room of Memorial Hall. A new computer was installed in Memorial Hall with software that would allow us to stream the service weekly with better sound and picture, and to both YouTube and Facebook simultaneously. Roy Schoeneman was integral in getting this procured for our church. And what great timing!

Fast forward to March 15 of 2020. Covid had just begun. We had 2 services that day, and the handbells played. No one knew quite what to expect next. Session met, and the decision was made to cancel in-person worship, starting the following week. A few folks were gathered to help sing the hymns, spaced from each other and masked, and I learned how to overlay words on the screen as the livestream happened. The words to the hymns, scriptures, and responsive readings were shown on the screen as the service played online.

When Easter rolled around, it was time for everyone to stay home. We pivoted again. As luck had it, I'd recorded Easter the previous year on my phone! We were able to sing at home "Alleluia to the Risen Lord" and "Jesus Christ is Risen

Today" complete with the horn accompaniment from the previous year! From then on, sections of the service were recorded each week on Thursday: the sermon, the pastoral prayers, and the responsive readings were done in the Sanctuary by Drew and Brenda, and recorded remotely by me at home. Nancy Worcester recorded a Children's Sermon each week with a puppet, and I created a spreadsheet of 52 (!) hymns from the months of October 2019 – March 2020 that had been

sung and recorded in previous live streams pre-covid. I cut out the hymns from those services, and added the words to the screen. Each service was a hodge-podge of months' worth of services, and hours worth of work at my computer, including the service I put together during the time in which Elliott was hospitalized for a dog bite.

This continued through March 2021. Week after week of newly hobbled together services, with fresh sermons, and hymns full of life and a sanctuary full of people, reminding us of our togetherness. In person worship, smaller and distanced, resumed March 21, 2021. A full year after services closed. We continued to overlay words for hymns, scripture readings, and responsive readings through May of 2021. (This can only be done when a person has created the slideshow for each week, and sits alone in

Memorial Hall at the computer during the service to bring up the words at the right time.)

August of 2024, I turned in my resignation from all things IT-related.

I streamed or pieced together the service from August of 2010 to May of

August of 2024, I turned in my resignation from all things IT-related I streamed or pieced together the service from August of 2019 to May of 2022. By then, I had 2 small children and not enough hands. Bianca Brownfield, Julie Dean, Kathy Long, and Linda Somervill, have all taken turns with the Sunday morning aspect as I continued to do the behind-the-scenes setup each week.

I am incredibly grateful to have been able to serve our church in this area of ministry. We were lucky to have not missed a single week during Covid, when so many other congregations struggled. Thank you for your trust in me to help us keep connected, then and after.

Now it's time for a few more hands to help make the work lighter. Pat Luley was most recently trained to stream using our software and the remote in the sanctuary and said "That's easy! I can do that!" Who's ready to raise their hand and say "I can too!"?

The camera movement is controlled via remote, and is done by a congregation member while worshipping in the Sanctuary

Good Bye to Summer, Hello Autumn, time to plan for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Maybe you think it is too early to be thinking about Thanksgiving and Christmas, but the Outreach & Mission Committee has begun planning for our mission projects for the residents of the Granbury Housing Authority. There are 100 residential units. Last fall there were 75 individuals and 25 families in residence. We provided turkeys and sides for Thanksgiving and Hams, & soup-in-a-jar for Christmas, upon request; and Christmas gift bags for all individuals and families. We also made 100 Christmas wreaths for each front door.

Our initial 2024 plan is to duplicate the food items for both Thanksgiving and Christmas. We have always received positive comments on these. We are also going to put together Christmas gift bags for both individuals and families. We will let you know of items you can contribute to the gift bags a little later.

People Helping People is requesting donations of stuffing mix, yams, and dessert mixes for the Thanksgiving meals. We will accept donations on their behalf in late October and early November. More information will be forthcoming.

The Habitat for Humanity lunches will resume in September. We will be serving lunch on the fourth Wednesday of each month, September - May. The next lunch will be September 25th. We will have sign-up sheets in the Narthex on September 15th and 22nd. We are requesting casseroles; salads, desserts, and bread; prepared and ready to serve. We pick-up the food from the Church Office at 10:00 a.m. on the morning of the lunch. Any reusable dishes will be brought back to the Office that afternoon. We serve lunch to approximately 25-30 Habitat Workers each month. Anyone wishing to go along and help serve the lunch is welcome. You can have lunch with us! The Habitat workers are very appreciative and always ask us to extend their Thanks to you. Thank You!




Growing in Grace & Gratitude is our curriculum for children ages 3–10. Children see God's




