Pastor's Pen...

Dear Faith Family of First Presbyterian Church Granbury,

What is God inviting you to do more fully with the TIME, TALENTS and TREASURES that God has given you?

Quite bluntly the question in the parable from Luke 16, is 'What have you done for me lately?" Think about when you are 'FAITHFUL with very little.' Maybe you have very little: a storm takes the roof off of your house, a loved one dies, a drunk driver runs a stop sign and kills a friend, a scam artist convinces you that you really do owe on toll tags, the cancer doctor tells you the cells are back, or your last treatment option/surgery is denied. The question isn't 'why do you have so little' the question is what do you do in the face of little? The parable of the Rich Man and the Manager, Luke 16, is a tough one to process. The Manager is accused of dishonesty. We don't know if the accusations are true. Nonetheless, the Manager, believing he will soon not have a job, starts to form friendships with the debtors of the Rich Man. The Manager put a priority on making friendships. He put his time and energy into making friendships with the debtors—not money. How can that point be wrong? When we are faced with 'little'—we are still faced with choices. We can choose to be angry and feel like victims. Or, we can select to do what Jesus commands "Seek ye first the kingdom of God." (Matthew 6:33)

My grandmother stood in a line in Wichita to catch a glimpse of President Kennedy. In the crowd my Grandmother Faye's glasses fell off of her face. President Kennedy stopped and bent to the ground, picked up her glasses, and placed them ever so gently back on her face.

Character shines through in our 'Faithfulness in very little.'

Short parable narratives are designed to shed light on a spiritual truth—usually with some sort of unexpected twist. The Rich Man/Dishonest Manager parable's impact is in the myriad of interpretations that leads to a big twist: **Shrewdness in stewardship matters**. The choice in the parable: **don't let your integrity slip in small matters and it will not fail you in crucial decisions either**: leads to a Manager practicing shrewdness. The Manager builds friendships! And, Jesus seems to praise him.

The Manager wants not only to keep his job, but to keep his power. **And, get this he keeps both. And, he is commended.**

The parable illustrates one of life's bittersweet realities: we will be faced with choices that are slippery and messy—we will demonstrate our faithfulness, and our devotion, by choosing to serve either wealth (ie. culture) or God. We will not always choose correctly. Injustice and 'realities of little' are part of life—how we respond is a matter of character and faith. Sometimes we are the Boss, the Parent, the Schoolteacher, the Employer, the Hospital Administrator, the Doctor—the ones in positions of authority who discover that people who report to us...employees, children, teenagers, students, patients, have done something where they have squandered either time, talents, or money—or all three. During times, like these, when we are the people in positions of authority, we confront the situation and give notice and an opportunity for self correction. We also must affirm, that those in authority aren't perfect either, and we know that they too need to be accountable also. The parable pertains to all!

May wisdom, and an assessment of our heart's treasures, guide us well.


The month starts out with the FALL RUMMAGE SALE October 3rd and 4th.



Heather Albrecht was hired as the Nursery Assistant Attendant.




