## Pastor's Pen...

Dear Visionaries of Christ at First Presbyterian,

There is an old Indian legend about a father and his three sons. He pointed to a high mountain many miles away and ordered the sons to climb up the mountain as far as they could and to bring back a memento of their adventure. One son returned with a rare flower. The second son came back with a rare rock. The third son returned and said "I climbed to the top and I brought back a vision of the sea." That is the most important of all; for if you have the vision, you can cultivate the flowers and quarry the rocks. In this particular case, it led them to build canoes and sail to a more fruitful and habitable island. With no vision, their lives were a restricted existence. God's vision for us is most visible in Christ. Jesus, a visionary, gave us the vision in Mark 16: 15, 16 "Go you into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." The homebound find connection through the Homebound Communion Team


The Admin Building has received ramps (thanks to the Property Team) that allow for people challenged by mobility to find a place to serve on Committees and feel included with the rest of the faith family

#### PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS SPECIAL OFFERING

We will receive the Peace & Global Witness Special Offering on Sunday, October 5, 2025. Offering envelopes will be inserted in the bulletin that day. If you prefer to give prior to October 5, you can write on your check or the offering envelope in the pew, "P & GW Special Offering."

Local congregations retain 25% of the offering received for use in the local community. The Outreach & Mission Committee has voted to donate our 25% to the Hood County Meals on Wheels program. You will be receiving weekly Minute for Mission emails describing this special offering.

#### **LOCAL OUTREACH & MISSION NEWS**

Meals on Wheels (MoW) - Hood County: Last fall we solicited volunteers to deliver meals with the MOW program in our community. We were successful in receiving four new volunteers to serve alongside other members who have volunteered with this program for several years, both here and in other locations. The feedback I have received has been very positive about this experience. Other news has not been quite so positive. It seems the funding that this program relies on has been reduced by more than 50% in FY 2025, resulting in a cut-back to the number of meals being provided to home-bound clients. There are residents in our community who rely on this service as their primary source of food. 

#### Seekers Class

September 14-November 23, 2025 Jay Bole will lead in this study of the book, "The Prayer of Unwanting: How the Lord's Prayer Helps Us Get Over Ourselves--and Why That Might Be a Good Thing" by David Williams. Novelist and pastor David Williams leads us toward a new encounter with the prayer Jesus taught us to pray. Prayed through millennia by believers in groups and alone, the Lord's Prayer speaks precisely to our age. Jesus taught his followers this prayer for a reason, and this same prayer rings true to those of us with a hunch that our desires are being endlessly manufactured, manipulated, and managed. With stories from scripture, whimsical anecdotes, and pastoral wisdom, Williams guides us into profound interaction with each line of the Lord's Prayer. Questions and ideas for ways to experience the Lord's Prayer can facilitate and deepen group conversation and individual prayer. There's power in the Lord's Prayer, Williams testifies, even if it's a power we have yet to understand. Copies of this book will be available in class. This class meets in the Adult Sunday School Classroom in Fellowship Hall. Other interesting topics are already planned for the season of Advent and into 2026.



# Session Highligh

The Faith Family is blessed by the capable and dynamic leadership of 13 Spiritual Elders and Treasurer.

The Session met on Tuesday, August 19. Thanks to the Fellowship team, the leaders break bread together and fuel their bodies ahead of time for the energy to lead and discern the spirit's movement better together.

Elder Mosley began the meeting with a beautiful prayer for discernment.

A lovely thank you note from Camp Gilmont was read. The church generously supported 10 campers in various Camps and retreats this summer.

The names of the 35 individuals who have joined the church since January 2024 were read out loud and with appreciation for God's blessings.

The Treasurer, Earl Darne, is in the process of completing the annual review of the financials for 2024. He is doing this with the Administration Elder. The most recent review was conducted for the calendar year 2020.

The Treasurer, Earl Darne, agreed to serve another year as Treasurer through 2026.

A contract for the asphalt was approved. The work will begin August 20. The Fellowship Hall Roof will be completed this week.

Many other projects (Sanctuary exterior painting, lighting replaced in Admin, Sanctuary foundation repairs done, ramps installed at ADMIN, locks replaced for Fellowship and Memorial Halls) have been completed (please thank the Property Team).

A motion prevailed to move \$150,000 from the general endowment fund for the deductible portion of the Roof Repairs (\$41,000) and general operating expenses.

A Youth Fund will be used to help send 10 kids that are registered for Winter Camp.

Christian Education made 10 motions, and they are highlighted in the September newsletter. 18 Adults were approved to teach children and adult Sunday School.

A Wednesday evening Children's program for Elementary School age children will begin: Presby Kids. The Wednesday program starts on 9/17 at 4:30 pm and will run until 5:45 pm. with a light supper and leadership by Bianca Brownfield and Nancy Bennett. The children will learn the Bible stories from Sunday School via art and music. Security will be present. They will share on Children's Sabbath.

Winter VBS will take place January 5-7 in the morning with security present.

An Arts and Crafts Fair will take place in Fellowship Hall November 8 hosted by the Fellowship Team. The RSVP for table for congregants is October 15. Table space \$20 for an 8-foot table and \$15 for a 6-foot table. After the 15th, table space will be open to community vendors/artists for \$25 for an 8-foot table and \$20 for a 6-foot table.

The meeting was closed with a benediction and the Lord's Prayer.





