# Outreach and Mission

In December, we provided 37 hams to families in the community for Christmas. We also provided gifts for 13 families, consisting of 30 individuals, who participated in our Angel Tree for the Granbury Housing Authority. Once again our Faith Family was extremely responsive.

Since this is my last article for the Bridge, I thought I would give you a quick look back at 2025:

The entire budget of \$80,366 has been expended. An additional \$6,845.84 has been expended from the Mission Offerings account, including cash donations totaling \$3,000 as follows:

Camp Gilmont	\$1,000
Presbyterian Children's Home & Services	\$ 500
Chrysalis Clergy	\$ 500
Meals on Wheels, Hood County	\$1,000

We have provided Habitat for Humanity Volunteers with monthly meals as scheduled.

We have provided the residents of the Housing Authority hams for Easter (43); and turkeys with side dishes for Thanksgiving (44); and Christmas hams (37); Angel Tree Gifts (30) as requested by families, and Summer Fun Gift Certificates as requested.

Members donated gift cards totaling \$3,000 and a cash donation of \$500 to buy back-to school shoes for children in foster care and provided the Rainbow Room with needed items totaling \$3,500 in-kind donations.

We provided Mission Granbury with five (5) "Laundry Baskets" filled with necessities for women leaving the shelter to get a fresh start in a new location. We participated in a food drive to supply the People Helping People food pantry.

Additionally, we have responded to 96 individual requests for emergency assistance with rent, utility payments, temporary lodging, food, etc.

It has been my privilege and a blessing to serve as Elder for Outreach & Mission these past three years. You have my sincere Thank You for your support, generosity, prayers and faith in making all this possible.

## COWBOY CORN CHOWDER


